SUBJECT GUIDE

Guidelines of Assam State School Education Board (Division-II)

Revised as per NEP-2020

Effective from 2025-2026 Academic Session

- There will be 6 compulsory subjects in total for all students.
- Subjects to be taken in each stream are divided in groups namely A, B, & C.
- A candidate shall opt all the Core subjects listed under Group A and Elective subjects listed in Group B & C as specified.
- For Science & Commerce Stream, each candidate has to opt 4[Four] elective subjects from Group -B or 3 elective subjects from Group-B and one Skill Subject from Group-C compulsorily. These elective subjects will be of 100 marks, may be with practical or without practical.
- For Arts Stream each candidate has to opt 3 elective subjects from Group-B and one Skill Subject from Group-C compulsorily. These elective subjects will be of 100 marks, may be with practical or without practical.
- In addition to the 4[Four] elective subjects, a candidate shall have to compulsorily study Environmental Education in Class XI and General Studies in Class XII for 50 marks each. The assessment of the subjects will be done internally (institution where studying) and Grade will be awarded.
- **It is desired that student of all streams shall choose their elective subjects keeping in view of their future courses of higher studies in general and other professional courses in particular.**

Key points relating examination & attendance

(As per the revised Academic Regulations of ASSEB Div.-II for H S Courses 2025)

- The H. S. 1st Year Examination, a candidate has to pass in both the MCQ type part and descriptive type part of the subject separately with 33% of marks as well as in the practical/ project portion and theoretical portion of the subjects, with compulsorily 33% of marks separately.
- For a subject having practical/ project parts the minimum pass marks shall be 33% of the marks allocated to the theory part and 33% of the marks allocated to the practical/ project part.
- In H. S. course curricula, the student must have to appear in 6[six] subjects and the result will be declared as PASS, only if the students will secure 33% of marks in aggregate, in spite of the fact that even if he fails in one subject. However, passing in English and MIL/Alt. Eng. is compulsory.
- As a candidate has offered 6 subjects, the decision to determine the best 5 subjects may be taken by the admitting institution/ employer. Further, it is informed that the ASSEB does not calculate/ declare/ inform percentage of marks. If the percentage of marks is required for higher education or in employment the calculation, if any, may be done by admitting institution or employer.
- ASSEB Div-II will award subject-wise grades to the candidates in class XI from the academic year 2025-26 & in Class XII Final Examinations from the academic year 2026-27 along with the marks secured by them in each subject. The awarded grades shall be reflected in the Mark-sheet cum Certificate issued to the candidates of class XI & XII as mentioned above.
- In skill-based subject(s) under Group C, the ratio of practical and the theoretical part will be in the ratio of 50:50
- Any student who has prosecuted a regular course of study either in the H. S. 1st Year or in the 2nd Year class may be allowed to appear in the H. S. First Year Examination or to the H. S. Final Examination in the appropriate stream as a regular candidate provided, he/she attended at least 75% of the classes held in each Subject. However, a candidate, who fails to attend 75% of the classes on medical ground or for any other reasonable ground, may also be allowed to appear in the H. S. First Year Examination or H. S. Final Examination as the case may be, on the basis of performance of the student in the Internal Examinations such as Unit Test/ Half Yearly Examination etc. with the permission of the ASSEB as a regular candidate.
- The result of the H. S. Final Examination will be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in H. S. Final Examination only. No credit of H S 1st Year examination shall be counted towards the result of H. S. Final Examination. The H. S. Final Examination shall be held in the month of February-March. Internal Examinations shall be taken by the institution for the students of the H. S. 1st Year and 2nd Year classes to accelerate their regular study habits.
- The District Examination Committee will conduct Internal Examination of Class XI and XII as per Government Guideline including Annual Examination of Class XI. The Question Papers should be concept based as far as practicable.
